





## CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (CPI) April, 2014: PRESS RELEASE

**Released on Thursday May 22, 2014 at 1:00 pm**

### APRIL 2014 MONTHLY INFLATION RATE INCREASES SLIGHTLY

The national monthly CPI (2007=100) increased from 224.79 per cent in March 2014 to 226.10 per cent in April, 2014 resulting in a 0.58 per cent increase in inflation rate this month. Similarly, the monthly rates of inflation increased slightly in all the regions. Western Area (0.75 per cent), Northern Region (0.70 per cent), Southern region(0.52 per cent) and the Eastern Region(0.97 per cent) comprising two centers, Kenema (0.80 per cent) and Kono (0.10 per cent) during the same period.

Nevertheless, the annual inflation rate for April, 2014 decreased slightly from 6.40 per cent in March, 2014 to 6.39 per cent in April, 2014. And the year-on-year rate of inflation decreased in Eastern region from 6.97 per cent in March, 2014 to 6.84 per cent in April, 2014 and in Southern region from 6.61 per cent in March, 2014 to 6.53 per cent in April, 2014 while the year-on-year in Western Area from 7.43 per cent in March, 2014 to 8.03 per cent in April, 2014 and in Northern region from 6.67 per cent in March, 2014 to 7.01 per cent in April, 2014. Figures 1.1 &1.2 below illustrate the movement in year-on-year rates of inflation and monthly rates of inflation respectively for National CPI and other CPI centers while table 1 below shows National CPI for the months of December, 2013 to April, 2014 and the 12 month change in the CPI for the main index groups. Considering the old CPI series (1992=100), the year-on-year rates of inflation decreased slightly in Freetown from 7.49 per cent in March, 2014 to 7.35 per cent in April, 2014 and in Bo from 8.80 per cent to 7.82 per cent while the year-on-year rate of inflation increased in Kenema from 6.98 per cent in March, 2014 to 7.11 per cent in April, 2014 and in Makeni from 8.13 to 8.27 per cent during the same period.



### FACTORS INFLUENCING CHANGES IN THE MONTHLY RATE OF INFLATION

The national monthly CPI (2007=100) increased from 224.79 per cent in March, 2014 to 226.10 per cent in April, 2014 resulting in a 0.58 per cent increase in inflation rate this month. However, this reflects a monthly increase that is lower than the previous month, meaning that prices are increasing at lower rate. There was a slight general increase in the price level in all the four regions which affected most of the components in the CPI basket.

On a national basis, there were increases in the indices for the following groups; food and non-alcoholic beverages(0.87 per cent), housing, water, electricity, gas & other fuels(0.39 per cent), alcoholic beverage, tobacco and narcotics(0.42 per cent), clothing and footwear (0.55 per cent), furnishing, household equipment and household maintenance(0.15 per cent), health(0.19 per cent), restaurant and hotels(0.60 per cent), transport (0.14 per cent) and Miscellaneous goods and services (1.06 per cent).The food products for which indices increased this month include bread and cereals (0.48 percent), fish and seafood (1.35 per cent), fruits(1.73 per cent), meat(0.57 per cent) , vegetables(2.06 per cent) and oils and fats(0.63 per cent). The increase on food indices in all the centers was probably due to the shortage of vegetables and fruits in the market.

**Column Description**

Column o : COICOP 12 functions

Column a : CPI weighting

Column b : CPI of the given month (m) for previous year

Column c : CPI of the given month (m -3) for current year

Column d : CPI of the given month (m -2) for current year

Column e : CPI of the given month (m -1) for current year

Column g : CPI monthly change in % ((f-e) x 100 /e)

Column h : CPI 3 months change in % ((f-c) x 100 /c)

Column i : CPI 12 months change in % ((f-b) x 100/b)

The National CPI measures the change in prices, on average, from month to month, of the goods and services bought by most households, in Freetown, Bo, Kenema and Makeni including all expenditure groups and both families and single persons. Prices are collected for 251 items. All prices collected are the prevailing retail market prices from six (6) markets in the Greater Freetown area, three (3) Markets in Bo Town, three (3) markets in Kenema Town and two (2) markets in Makeni Town for weekly prices and other outlets for monthly items whose prices are less likely to fluctuate rapidly. The National Index was computed by aggregating the CPI for the four index towns previously published separately with different base periods. The old CPI series for Bo, Kenema, Makeni and Freetown were rebased to base year 2003, Computation

Methodology changed from the Modified to the Traditional Laspeyres, and transformed into the Classification of Individual Consumption by Purpose (COICOP) with 12 functions. The separate center CPIs were aggregated at the sub-class level at which level new weights were also introduced to obtain the Interim National Index.

## **FREETOWN CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (1992=100)-OLD SERIES**
