


MARCH 2013 MONTHLY INFLATION RATE INCREASES SLIGHTLY

The national monthly CPI (2007=100) increased from 208.83 per cent in February 2013 to 211.27 per cent in March, 2013 resulting in a 1.17 per cent increase in inflation rate this month. Similarly, the monthly rates of inflation increased slightly in all the regions. Western Area (1.35 per cent), Northern Region (0.98 per cent), Southern region(0.92 per cent) and the Eastern Region(0.84 per cent) comprising of two centers, Kenema(0.64 per cent) and Kono (1.28 per cent) during the same period.

In addition, the annual Inflation rate for March, 2013 increased slightly from 11.54 per cent in February, 2013 to 11.63 per cent in March, 2013. This reflects a 0.09 percentage point increase over February 2013.

Considering the old CPI series (1992=100), the year-on-year rates of inflation increased slightly in all the centers except Kenema. Freetown from 10.63 per cent to 10.89 per cent, in Bo from 12.64 per cent to 13.77 percent, in Makeni from 12.18 per cent to 12.45 per cent while in Kenema the year-on-year rate of inflation decreased from 12.13 per cent to 11.14 per cent during the same period.



FACTORS INFLUENCING CHANGES IN THE MONTHLY RATE OF INFLATION

The national monthly CPI (2007=100) increased from 208.83 per cent in February 2013 to 211.27 per cent in March, 2013 resulting in a 1.17 per cent increase in inflation rate this month. There was a general increase in the price level in all the four regions affecting all components of the index. On a national basis, there were increases in the indices for the following groups; food and non-alcoholic beverages (1.18 percent), alcoholic beverage, tobacco and narcotics (2.07 per cent), clothing and footwear (0.88 per cent), housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels (1.92 per cent), furnishing, household equipment and household maintenance (1.56 per cent), health (1.0 per cent), communication (0.15 per cent) and restaurant and hotels (1.45 per cent). The food products which increased this month include bread and cereals (0.59 percent), fruits (1.51 per cent), milk, cheese and eggs (3.35 per cent), meat (0.77 per cent) and oils and fats (1.97 per cent) and vegetables (2.40 per cent).

Column Description

Column o : COICOP 12 functions

Column a : CPI weighting

Column b : CPI of the given month (m) for previous year

Column c : CPI of the given month (m - 3) for current year

Column d : CPI of the given month (m - 2) for current year

Column e : CPI of the given month (m - 1) for current year

Column g : CPI monthly change in % ((f-e) x 100 /e)

Column h : CPI 3 months change in % ((f-c) x 100 /c)

Column i : CPI 12 months change in % ((f-b) x 100/b).

The National CPI measures the change in prices, on average, from month to month, of the goods and services bought by most households, in Freetown, Bo, Kenema and Makeni including all expenditure groups and both families and single persons. Prices are collected for 251 items. All prices collected are the prevailing retail market prices from six (6) markets in the Greater Freetown area, three (3) Markets in Bo Town, three (3) markets in Kenema Town and two (2) markets in Makeni Town for weekly prices and other outlets for monthly items whose prices are less likely to fluctuate rapidly. The National Index was computed by aggregating the CPI for the four index towns previously published separately with different base periods. The old CPI series for Bo, Kenema, Makeni and Freetown were rebased to base year 2003, Computation methodology changed from the Modified to the Traditional Laspeyres, and transformed into the Classification of Individual Consumption by Purpose (COICOP) with 12 functions. The separate center CPIs were aggregated at the sub-class level at which level new weights were also introduced to obtain the Interim National Index.
